## REMEMBERING ROGER SIMON

**Roger Simon**, former professor at the Ontario Institute for Studies in Education (OISE), University of Toronto passed away on September 17, 2012. Roger Simon partnered with MHSO in 2003 to develop *Problematics of Exhibiting Archival Material From the Vilna Ghetto*. He also taught at OISE for more than 40 years and published widely on many issues. Most recently, he addressed questions of the pedagogical and ethical dimensions of practices of cultural memory, issues of remembrance and the development of historical consciousness.

## MHSO PARTNERS WITH SERVE! TO ENGAGE YOUTH FOR CHANGE

The federally funded **Serve! Canada** program reaches out to at-risk youth from 18 to 25 years of age who are not currently working or in school. This program provides youth the opportunity to develop skills and gain experience in different internship placements within communities and organizations across Ontario. The MHSO partnered with the Serve! in 2012 and 2013, and offered hands-on workshops related to interview techniques and oral history projects.



## MULTICULTURAL ONTARIO IN THE CLASSROOM | MHSO PRESENTS AT OHASSTA

On November 24, 2012, the MHSO led a workshop at the Ontario History and Social Science Teachers' Association Conference (OHASSTA) at the White Oaks Conference Resort and Spa at Niagara-on-the-Lake. Cathy Leekam, Program Manager, and Vanessa Tamburro, Education Programme Officer, presented *Immigrant History and Multicultural Ontario in the Classroom* to a group of over 30 education

professionals from across Canada.
