Title: Ad for Big Horn Brand - "Chinese-made Shirts and Overalls Must Go!"

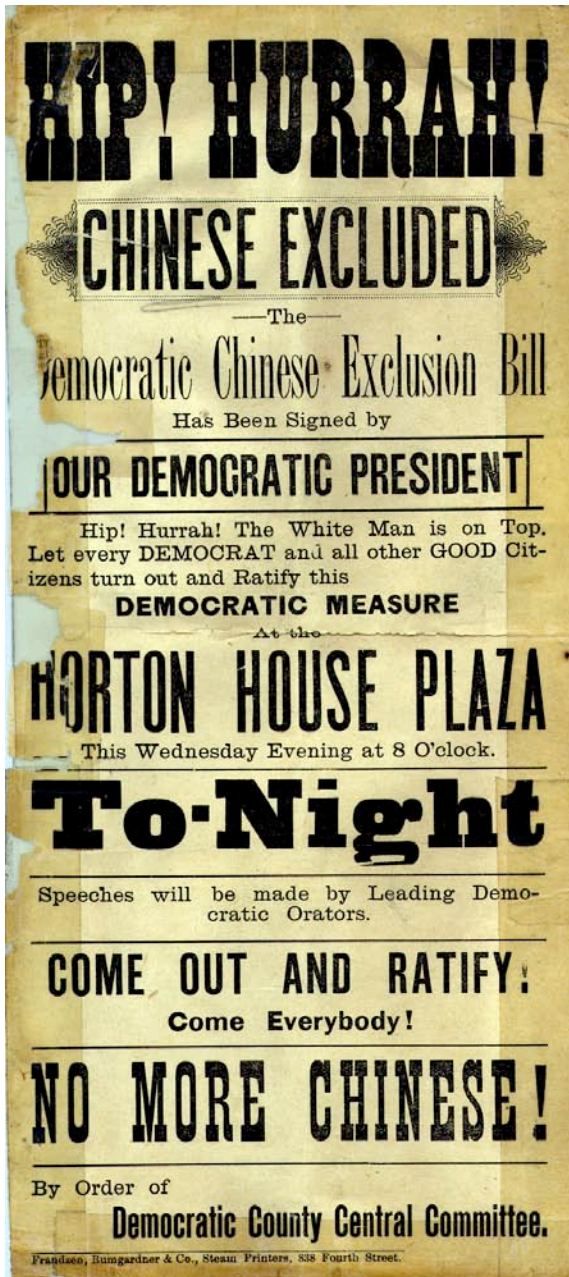

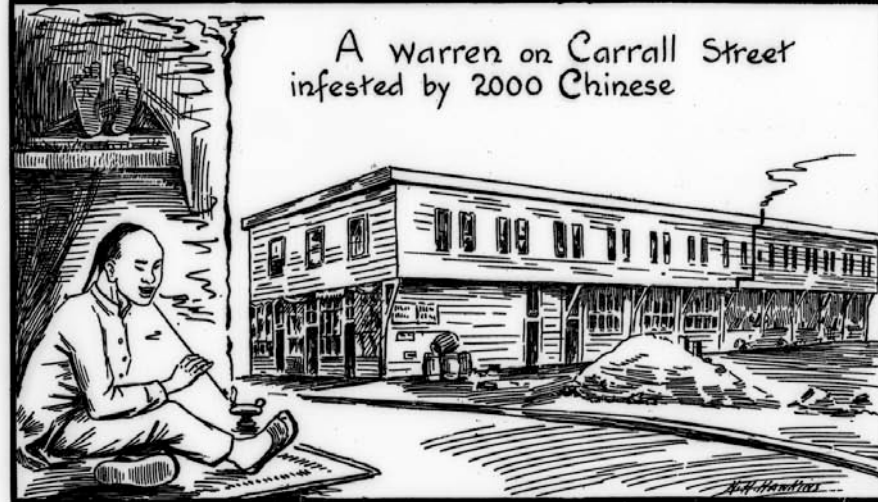

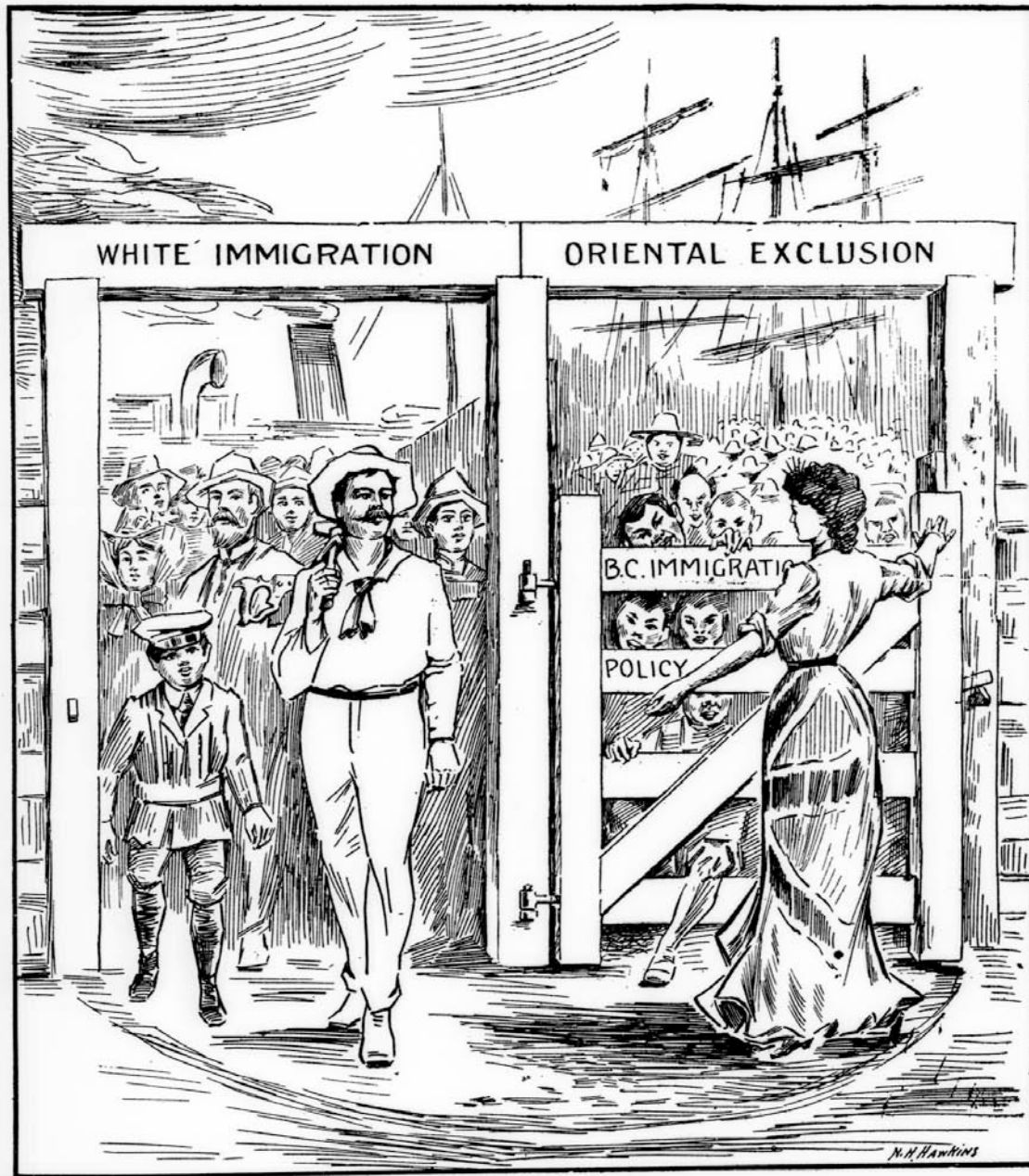
